

Fundraising Programs:



St. Paul Preschool takes part in a national fund-raising program sponsored by Tyson Foods, Inc. The program is called Tyson Project A+™ and it works like this: There's a Tyson Project A+™ label, worth 24¢, on various Tyson products that feature the Tyson Project A+™ logo on the front of the package. Schools earn money from Tyson by collecting and redeeming the labels. Participating schools can earn up to \$12,000 per academic year, and there are no restrictions on how the funds are used. Students can turn labels in to their classroom teacher or drop them off in the basket on the front desk. Our goal by the end of each school year is to collect 1,000 labels.

Teracycles purpose is to eliminate the idea of waste. They do this by creating national recycling systems for previously non-recyclable or hard-to-recycle waste. Anyone can

sign up for these programs, called the Brigades, and start sending us waste. TerraCycle then converts the collected waste into a wide variety of products and materials. With more than 20 million people collecting waste in over 20 countries TerraCycle has diverted billions of units of waste and used them to create over 1,500 different products available at major retailers ranging from Walmart to Whole Foods Market.
